



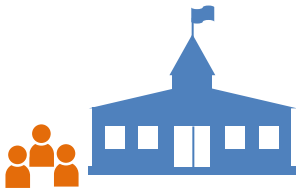

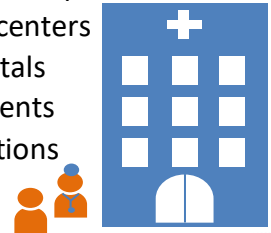
Community education and clinical training improves readiness, willingness, and ability of health professions trainees to serve in primary care, and rural, urban, and underserved community settings.

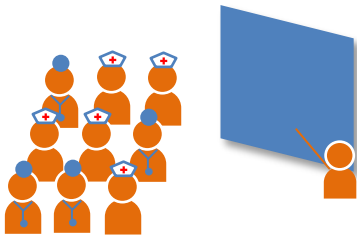
